#### Mission & Vision

**Mission statement**: We strive to offer our partners support, the best we can in raising funds to bring their projects to the finish line. Most of the projects supported are geared to uplift the lifestyle of the POOR through Education and providing basic needs.

**Vision statement:** To be PART OF THE SOLUTION to ADDRESS GLOBAL POVERTY.

## **Strategic Goals Implemented**

### 1. Awareness Campaign

For a young non-profit organization, AWARENESS is often the first step towards achieving its goals Increasing donations, or recruiting great volunteers and board members

FFP uses social media (FB, Instagram, and LinkedIn) just to be present.

## 2. Fundraising

The most important goal a nonprofit organization has is RAISING FUNDS to SURVIVE. FFP conducted project presentations for a specific mission area especially if it entails construction. This is very effective since prospective donors can easily pledge since the project is presented on a phase-by-phase basis with the corresponding cost.

FFP eventually has a core of Team Leaders for each mission area. For example, Doina Eipuras spearheads Moldova Project. For Nigeria, Angela Nwaneri leads it, while Alice Mungwa led the fundraising for Betterway Africa (Cameroon).

To support this effort, FFP hired the services of Shannon Ross, a grant writer, to explore opportunities in applying for grants from grantors with requirements that best fit the organization's partner's needs. Last year a grant was awarded unanimously to Haven of Hope by Loyola Foundation.

## 3. Recruited Volunteers

It was challenging for us to recruit volunteers. Recruiting volunteers is indeed the key goal of many nonprofits. We continuously recommend to the board and volunteers that we tap our circle of friends & relatives who know us inside and out and invite them to join. To a certain extent, FFP is successful, especially in picking up and delivering the pretzels for the pantry in Lambertville, NJ.



#### 4. Recruitment of donors

When it comes to an increased donor base, again, FFP faces some challenges. We continuously recommend to the board and volunteers that we tap our circle of friends & relatives who trust us. We started with our existing network – our community during get-togethers and small parties. We spoke about FFP's future goals and how their support can help to achieve them. We encouraged them to visit the website so they will know more about the organization.

## 5. Corporate partnerships

Corporate partnerships are powerful. We identified corporations using Cybergrant and Benevity as their donation platform. We tried to reach out to the management and signified our interest in promoting Foundation for the Poor Inc to their employees.

#### 6. Boost email

Email marketing was consistently used, and E-greeting cards were sent during holidays or birthdays if we got hold of birthdays & anniversaries.

#### Conclusion

FFP's goals vary each year depending on the proposals submitted by our partnerorganizations how fast they submit. Grant applications also take a while.

FFP had concluded its relationship with Foundation Group. FFP has a new expert on board, Mr. Umesh Malikum to handle renewals and taxation. FFP has hired bookkeeping services from JL Accounting LLC in Doylestown.

Joey Cecilia del Prado is now focused on looking for platforms to generate funds . This allows having a chance to truly reflect on FFP's mission and future while creating a direction that everyone can work towards.

We give merit to our generous donors with big hearts for the POOR for FFP's milestones. This allowed us to celebrate our wins at the end of the year 2022.



#### 2022 Milestones

## 1) <u>Betterway Africa International – Cameroon</u>

**Project**: Completion of the Schoolhouse Renovation Project at Bonayang Ngie, Northwest region of Cameroon. This will accommodate 100 students at this village school. This provides an adequate environment for education for them to continue their studies so they can become productive citizens in the future and redeem themselves from poverty.

**Project Cost**: \$15,800

Activity: Fundraising program conducted November 6th

Venue: del Prado Residence Number of attendees: 8 pax Number of donors: 4 couples

Result: \$15,000 raised

Allocation of funds will be on a phased basis. Currently, they are working on the

masonry phase.

## 2) Haven of Hope - India

**Project**: The Sanjeevani Society will spearhead in building the Udaan Rehabilitation Center to provide disability support services to a target group of 1,200 identified people with disabilities, malnourishment and pediatric disease, living in rural Harrai.

Project Cost: \$45,730.46

**Activity:** Grant Application by Ms. Shannon Ross, FFP grant writer **Result**: Grant Awarded to FFP is \$20,000 last August 20,22 from LOYOLA FOUNDATION. The Board unanimously selected Haven of Hope. The grant aims to strengthen the program and methods for children with disabilities through this community-based rehabilitation and associated institutional care to empower persons with disabilities, especially children and youth. Other sources of funds: Fr. Pauly Thekkan and CMI Seva Sangh's contribution. Update: They started the groundwork.

## 3. Moldova Project - Moldova

Moldova is the poorest nation in Europe, yet they open its borders to welcome Ukrainian refugees. Since Moldova Project is one of our partner beneficiaries, FFP supports the effort. FFP donated 2k early last year. There is ongoing fundraising on our social media posting, aiming to raise more and remit to them asap. FFP salutes the Moldovans for their big hearts!





## 4. Ireze Foundation - Nigeria

**Project**: Renovation/Construction of St. Augustine's Model Secondary School – 13 classrooms, Functional Chemistry, Physics and Biology Lab, Ongoing Construction of Administrative Block

**Project Cost**: \$27,593 – Fundraising program was conducted last November of 2021, However with the new plan and the increased of prices of the construction materials, there will be a change of project cost.

**Update**: Renovation/Construction is still ongoing. The Project Coordinator, Ms. Angela Nwaneri, informed FFP that there is a change in the plan because of a change of administration. The building they selected was the admin building which had already been roofed. The classrooms are being built in the two structures which need roofing which is now Stage 1 in the new breakdown. Roofing was not on the original list.

from the river the same water where they bathe, wash, cook and drink.


Project Cost: \$13,600


Activity: Solicitation via email & social media in collaboration with Talent

## 7. Pastor Bernard Arati - Kenya


**Project:** Christmas Meals for the 25 orphans
